# NATIONAL HEALTH SERVICES FEE SCHEDULE

2015

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### Rationale:

Section 33(3) of the Ministry of Health Act 2013 ("the Act") confers discretion on the Ministry of Health ("the Ministry") to develop and apply a system of charges for health services provided that it is based on "user pays" principles. It also empowers the Ministry to verify identity by requiring production of a patient's passport or other means of identification.

Section 7(3) of the Act states that the Ministry has the power to provide any health service, or to arrange for and provide health services by or through a health service provider, subject to any approved government policy, and any requirement relating to payment or reimbursement of costs of such services by the patient.

Section 29 of the Act provides the general provision for protecting the rights of the Patient specifically general principles relating to medical records and health information.

Section 33(2) of the Act confers a power on the Minister of Health to approve fees and charges for any service provided by or on behalf of the Ministry under the Act.

Note: All health service users when registering for Health services must show their Passport.

- 1. Must show their passport- if you are not born in the Cook Islands or do not have the Cook Islands official immigration stamp on your passport then you must provide proof of your Cook Islands heritage.
- 2. Must show Permanent Residency/ Honorary Residency certificate or Passport for Permanent / honorary Residency Stamp. Children of Permanent residents are included in category I.
- 3. Must show Marriage Certificate.
- 4. Must show proof of permanent employment with a valid work permit and RMD number.
- 5. Partner must be a Cook Islander and acknowledge parentage in writing before the birth of the child. If the child's Birth Certificate shows a Cook Islander as the father, this will be sufficient proof for a Non-Cook Islands woman to receive a refund of appropriate costs incurred in giving birth and to remain in this category. Note that a birth certificate must be given to the Ministry of Health to verify parentage within 14 days of birth.
- 6. Must show Proof of health insurance.
- 7. Must show passport.
- \* Anyone 16 years of age and over and at secondary school must show proof of enrolment.

### Payment of Fees:

Fees must be paid at the time services are provided.

All patients are encouraged to settle all outstanding accounts for health services provided. Time payments can be scheduled and it is expected that 50% of the account will be settled before discharge.

#### Exemptions:

The following Cook Islanders and Permanent Residents are exempt from charges:

- 1. Persons 60 years and older;
- 2. The Infirm and destitute;
- 3. Chronic disability;
- 4. Pa Enua residents; and
- 5. Persons 16 years and under plus 16 years and over who are students at secondary school.

#### **Definitions:**

- 1. 16 years and under- the date of turning 16 years and under.
- 2. 60 years and over- the date of turning 60 and over.
- 3. Infirm and destitute- A person registered with the Cook Islands Ministry of Internal Affairs and currently receiving welfare payments;
- Permanent Resident- a person who has the status of a permanent resident of the Cook Islands pursuant to Article 76A of the Cook Islands constitution (as enacted by section 13 of the Constitution Amendment (No.9) Act 1980-81.
- 5. Cook Islander- a person belonging to the part of the Polynesian race indigenous to the Cook Islands; and includes any person descended from a Cook Islander.
- 6. Honorary Resident- a person who has the status of a Honorary Resident of the Cook Islands pursuant to the Laws of the Cook Islands.
- 7. Chronic disability- where a person's disabilities limit them from providing an income for themselves.
- 8. Pa Enua- All islands of the Cook Islands outside of Rarotonga
- 9. Expatriate a person temporarily or permanently residing in a country other than that of their citizenship.

**Note:** Costs were set with "user pays" principles in mind having regard to the labour and resources expended on the services provided.

<u>ALL ALCOHOL RELATED MOTOR VEHICLE CRASHES-</u> consultations and admissions will carry an additional charge regardless of Patient Category or Status and whether they live in Rarotonga or the Pa Enua. If the Patient was not directly responsible for the motor vehicle crash then the recovery for costs becomes a civil case. A medical report will be provided to the patient to facilitate their claim. It is the patient's responsibility to provide the evidence.
