
With the declaration of the Dengue (DENV-1) outbreak in Feb 2019, public health control measures have been ongoing. DENV-2 was identified in 2020. While most dengue cases were reported in Rarotonga, some cases were identified in the Pa Enua - Aitutaki and Pukapuka. Control measures included:

- Public awareness campaigns
- Community involvement for national clean up days
- Tutaka environment risk assessment
- Vector control perifocal/block spraying

In recent months, there has been a decline in the number of dengue cases. There were two probable cases reported in the past 6 weeks (Epi weeks 38-43). The dengue outbreak in the Cook Islands has been declared over.



In the past 6 weeks (Epi weeks 38-43), two probable cases have been reported, and no confirmed cases. Age range of cases in 2020: 4 years to 84 years old.

No deaths attributed to dengue infection.
